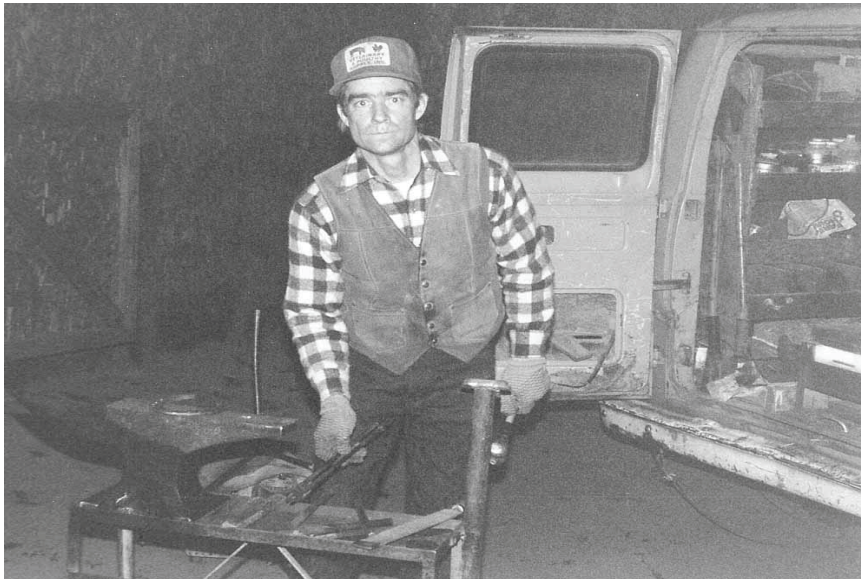
By-laws: Nothing new to report

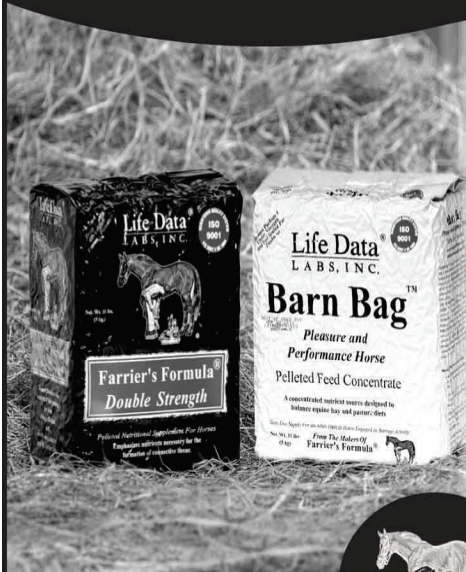

"THE QUENCH BUCKET"

Trade tips & handy bits of information

A tip that I came up with that I think is an original idea. I haven't heard anywhere else. I call it ring around the horse.

"Ring Around The Horse"

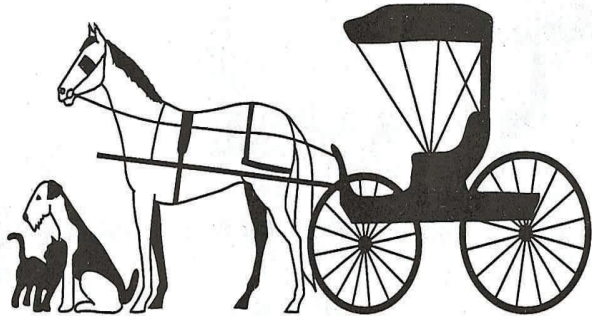
When you get a young horse, (not necessarily a foal, you can muscle your way with them) an aged arthritic horse, or a horse with short attention span or antsy that you have to trim, start with say the right front hoof and just pick the hoof out and give the leg back. Go to the other front hoof and just pick it out, move to the hind foot and pick it out then to last hind hoof. Then go back to the front and pare the first hoof out and give it back and rotate all the way around the horse with just paring. Then back to the beginning and just nip and move around the horse again. Lastly start again with the first hoof and rasp the bottom and round the corners and rotate again around the horse. Normally by the third time around the horse will be shifting and offering you the next hoof. To finish the job you may have to dress the tops, on your knee if they are too offended by your stall jack. By the time you are done with ring around the horse you will have taught him that you are not going to keep his hoof and make him uncomfortable for very long. Old horses will love you for using this technique, because I have found they aren't trying to be bad they just can't tolerate giving the leg up for the entire time it takes to pick, pare, nip and rasp all at one time. Young horses will learn real fast what you are up to and will be more co-operative. Short attention, antsy horses will have something to keep their attention as you buzz around and around them. When a horse owner picks out a horse hoof they normally just pick it up just high enough to get their pick in there and out lickity split and if the horse says no they usually won't push it.

So by using this technique you are basically giving the horse 4 to 5 lessons in one session. It may take an extra five to ten minutes to get the job done, but it's money in your pocket without the pain and frustration of fighting an unwilling or aged aching old timer. Hey it makes sense to me.....give "Ring Around The Horse" a try.

I generally soak them over a weekend, careful to keep the container out of kids' reach and away from pets. Put a post-it on your steering wheel or visor as a reminder so Monday morning all your tools are where they should be. ~Julie
